His doctoral dissertation, entitled "Mobilis in Mobile: The French and German Socialists in Hostile Environments, 1921-1933/40," explores French and German Socialist newspapers in the 1920s and 1930s. Alban Bargain's current research involves a comparative study of Arran, Borkum, and Groix, three small islands off the coasts of Scotland, France, and Germany, respectively. This study, which will span the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries, will deal with the effects of transatlantic encounters on Arran, Borkum, and Groix, as well as with the social, political, and cultural history of the islands themselves during the 1848-1940 period.
